ABOUT THE DAY TREATMENT PROGRAM

About the Program

The Day Treatment Program aims to help students in grades K-12 who are struggling with mental health, behavioral and emotional issues to achieve success in both the home and school environment.

The Day Treatment Program provides multidisciplinary and intensive clinical services, including individual, family and group therapy. Individualized educational services are provided in coordination with the student's school district and are consistent with her or his Individualized Education Plan (IEP).


The Goal is...

To successfully return students to a public school setting.

How does the program work?

- Children work with an interdisciplinary team of therapists, teachers and teaching assistants.
- The program uses the research-based Trauma Informed Care Treatment Model that helps children and families to process traumatic events and triggers so that they can learn and cope and heal.
- Academic curricula is offered for special education students in grades K-12 that addresses their educational and affective needs, and aligns with their IEP.
- Students choose certain classes and activities and move to different classrooms, just as they would in their home school districts.
- Classroom ratio is small...8 students to 1 Teacher and 1 Teaching Assistant in the secondary classrooms. 1 Teacher and 2 Teacher Assistants in the elementary classroom.





What services are provided?

- Psychiatric care and medication management services are provided "in house."
- Adjunctive services such as animal assisted therapy, speech and occupational therapy and vocational services are provided.
- A computer lab is provided where students develop skills related to technology and to access educational opportunities in another media.
- A Life Skills curriculum is offered in an effort to assist students with goal oriented planning for their lives after high school graduation.



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
