In Focus: Preventing Suicide in the Community

This month is Suicide Prevention Month, and Community Reach Center proudly participated in the recent Out of the Darkness walk in Denver. Together, we joined thousands of others in raising awareness and support for suicide prevention. We had a record-breaking turnout of CRC staff walking side by side with our community to honor lives lost, uplift survivors, and stand together for hope.



Among those walking was Emma Wallingford, a clinician at Stages - Acute

Treatment Unit. Her dedication to suicide prevention runs deep and was recently shared in CRC's podcast series, Reach for Wellness. In this episode, Emma shared her passion for leading our suicide prevention group, where clients have a safe and supportive space to share their struggles without fear or judgment. Her commitment to this work began with a simple yet powerful personal mission of never wanting anyone to feel like they have to suffer in silence. This commitment to prevention also shines through CRC's new engagement model, designed to help individuals navigate their mental health journeys by fostering multiple touchpoints with providers in a single treatment week. By increasing engagement through individual and group therapy, peer support, care management, and more, clients can establish healthy routines at our outpatient clinics, address challenges early on, and reach their goals. These frequent sessions help foster positive changes over time and become an important step in reducing suicide risk and strengthening overall mental health.

Together, our staff, community, and clients remind us that suicide prevention is not just about awareness; it's about action, connection, and creating safe spaces where no one has to struggle in silence.
